Whereas, Registered Apprenticeships serve as a powerful model for career development, expanding opportunities for women, especially young women, to gain valuable skills, earn while they learn and build meaningful, long-term careers; and

Whereas, Increasing participation of women in apprenticeships strengthens the workforce, fosters innovation and enhances economic stability across all sectors in Massachusetts; and

Whereas, Massachusetts remains committed to breaking down barriers to employment, ensuring women from all walks of life have access to inclusive training opportunities and career advancement through Registered Apprenticeships; and

Whereas, Women of color have historically been excluded from apprenticeship opportunities that lead to family-supporting wages; and

Whereas, Apprenticeships help alleviate racial and gender disparities in the workforce by providing more opportunities to women of color and communities of color; and

Whereas, Supporting women in apprenticeship reflects the Healey-Driscoll Administration's commitment to equity, diversity and the empowerment of individuals to reach their fullest potential,
