

Background

- 2030 Solid Waste Master Plan called for Reduce & Reuse (R&R) Working Group and Action Plan
- R&R Working Group established 2020
 - Series of stakeholder meetings (2020-2021)
 - 655 members to date
- Published R&R Action Plan (Dec. 2021)

Measuring Progress

- Waste prevention is difficult to measure.
- Can track adoption and impact of reduce and reuse efforts:
 - Grants requested and awarded
 - Project results
 - Technical assistance requests
 - Access to local reuse hubs
 - (Libraries of things, repair events, swap shops, zero waste events, private and nonprofit organizations, etc.)
- Waste characterization data




