FAIRHAVEN – Scotic Neck Road Improvements, Safe Routes to School, Leroy Wood Elementary School

What is happening?

The purpose of this Design Public Hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Scotic Neck Road Improvements. All views and comments made at the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

How will this affect you?

The project proposes to reconstruct Scotic Neck Road from approximately 350 feet north of David Drown Boulevard to the northerly entrance to the Leroy Wood Elementary School. The improvements are intended to provide enhanced pedestrian safety and mobility and improved bicycle accommodation with specific emphasis on safe access to the Leroy Wood Elementary School. Improvements include new sidewalks and curb ramps for pedestrian accommodation meeting ADA/AAB requirements as well as striped bicycle lanes on both sides of Scotic Neck Road. Minor geometric improvements are proposed along with milling and overlaying of the roadway pavement prior to the application of new pavement markings.
