

## In-Person Project Information Meeting Resurfacing and Related Work on Route 110

## What is happening?

The purpose of this meeting is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Lowell—Dracut—Methuen — Resurfacing and Related Work on Route 110 project. All views and comments submitted in response to the meeting will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

## How will this affect you?

The revised design moving forward will no longer be proposing a shared use path along the south side of the road. Instead, there will be bike lanes on either side of the road, buffered from the vehicle lanes by a painted buffer containing flex posts. The sidewalk along the north side of the roadway will be reconstructed to be 5-ft wide and ADA compliant. All MassDOT projects need to include considerations for bikes and pedestrians. All work will be done within the state-owned layout.

We also agree that the speeds of motor vehicles along the corridor need to be reduced. Providing narrower lanes, and now buffered bike lanes, will help with that speed reduction, as roadway narrowing is a proven traffic calming technique as are median islands which are also proposed at various locations. There will be breaks in the flex posts for all driveways with plenty of space for access to your property for vehicle maneuvers, trash pick-up, and mail or other delivery.
