Bridge Replacement, Jerusalem Road over Hop Brook

What is happening?

The purpose of this hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed project. All views and comments submitted in response to the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

How will this affect you?

The proposed project consists of a complete replacement of bridge T-10-003; this existing bridge structure, built in 1960, which carries Jerusalem Road over Hop Brook known as the "Library Bridge", located in Historic Tyringham Village is nearing its estimated lifespan due to daily wear and tear and is in need of a new bridge structure, wearing surface, and railing system on an off the bridge to bring it up to current design standards. No pedestrian or bicycle accommodation improvement are proposed. The replacement bridge will be a 60-foot single span concrete beam bridge. The bridge will be closed for the duration of construction; a detour will be provided for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
