A Live Virtual Design Public Hearing will be hosted on the MassDOT website below to present the design for the proposed Jacksonville Stage Road (SR 8A) over the West Branch Brook project in Heath, MA.

WHEN: 6:30 PM, Tuesday, May 2nd, 2023

PURPOSE: The purpose of this hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Jacksonville Stage Road (SR 8A) over the West Branch Brook bridge replacement project in Heath, MA. All views and comments submitted in response to the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

PROPOSAL: The proposed project will provide a complete bridge replacement of the existing bridge carrying Jacksonville Stage Road (SR 8A) over the West Branch Brook in Heath, MA. The existing bridge was constructed in 1939 and is in poor condition due to its age. The intent of the proposed design is to replace the bridge to improve accessibility for all users. Presently, there are no existing shoulders on the bridge. The proposed improvements include lengthening of the bridge span and widening of the bridge width so that 3.0' shoulders are provided for improved bicycle accommodation and accessibility. There are no sidewalks on the bridge nor off the bridge, both in the existing and proposed conditions.

A secure right-of-way is necessary for this project. Acquisitions in fee and permanent or temporary easements may be required. The Town of Heath is responsible for acquiring all needed rights in private or public lands. MassDOT's policy concerning land acquisitions will be presented in the hearing.

This hearing is accessible to people with disabilities. WHAT IS A PUBLIC HEARING?

WHY A PUBLIC HEARING?

To provide an assured method whereby the Commonwealth of Massachusetts can furnish to the public information concerning the State's highway construction proposals, and to afford every interested resident of the area an opportunity to be heard on any proposed project. At the same time, the hearings afford the Commonwealth an additional opportunity to receive information from local sources which would be of value to the State in making its final decisions to what design should be advanced for development.

WHY NOT A VOTE ON HIGHWAY PLANS?

The hearings are not intended to be a popular referendum for the purpose of determining the nature of a proposed improvement by a majority of those present. They do not relieve the duly constituted officials of a State highway department of the necessity for making decisions in State highway matters for which they are charged with full responsibility.

WHAT DOES A PUBLIC HEARING ACCOMPLISH?

It is designed to ensure the opportunity for, or the availability of, a forum to provide factual information which is pertinent to the determination of the final alternative considered by the state to best serve the public interest, and on which improvement projects are proposed to be undertaken.

It is important that the people of the area express their views in regard to the proposal being presented, so that views can be properly recorded in the minutes of the meeting. These minutes will be carefully studied and taken into consideration in the determination of the final design.

RIGHT OF WAY CONCERNS

Your Municipality is responsible for securing the right of way for this project. If your property, or a portion of it, must be acquired by the Municipality for highway purposes in the interest of all people of the Commonwealth, your rights are fully protected under the law. Briefly, here are some of the answers to questions you might ask.

1. REASON FOR PROJECT

The completion of this project will serve local needs. The proposed enhancement will also be in the interest of others in the greater community, and provide for the public good.

2. WHO CONTACTS ME?

Representatives of the municipality have already contacted or will contact you. They will explain the procedures used in acquiring any necessary rights in land.

3. WHAT ABOUT DONATIONS? WHAT IS A RIGHT OF ENTRY?

Town officials will often seek donations, of parcels, where permanent rights are required. This procedure will minimize the acquisition cost for your community.


A Right of Entry is a document that is signed by the owner. It allows the Contractor to perform certain types of work on the owner's land. The work is usually minor in nature and frequently consists of loaming/seeding behind sidewalks, new driveway apron work, grading/sloping, and wetland protection, etc. The rights granted are temporary in nature.

4. WHAT IS A FAIR PRICE FOR THE ACQUIRED PARCELS?

In the event that donations are not considered, or completed, every effort will be made to ensure that an equitable value is awarded. Municipal and/or outside appraisers will complete an appraisal. Consideration is given to the type of rights needed, whether in fee, permanent or temporary easements. The appraisal will be the basis for arriving at a fair price (for damages that result).

5. MUST I ACCEPT THE MUNICIPALITY OFFER?

No, if the owner feels that the offer is not fair the owner may petition the courts. This action does not stop or delay the acquisition. The action must occur within 3 years. The owner(s) may be paid pro tanto (for the time being). The pro tanto payment will not prejudice the court's final decision.



BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT NO. 607678 JACKSONVILLE STAGE ROAD (ROUTE 8A) OVER THE WEST BRANCH BROOK

Proposed Purpose:

The proposed project will provide a complete bridge replacement of the existing bridge carrying Jacksonville Stage Road (State Route 8A) over the West Branch Brook in Heath, MA. The bridge is located approximately 200 feet west of Sumner Stetson Road and is bounded by a residence to the west and wooded land to the north, south, and east. Jacksonville Stage Road (Route 8A) is classified as a rural roadway with a low volume of traffic that runs in the east-west directions as it crosses West Branch Brook. The entire roadway is undivided without pavement markings, with one travel lane in each direction. There is a horizontal roadway curve on Jacksonville Stage Road (Route 8A) at the western approach of the bridge. The existing bridge was constructed in 1939 and is in poor condition due to its age. Presently, there are no existing shoulders, sidewalks, or pavement markings on the bridge. Though short-term repairs have been previously implemented, a long-term solution is needed. The purpose or intent of this project is to reconstruct the bridge to bring it to a state of good repair and meet current design standards, which in turn improves accessibility for all users.

Proposed Improvements and Extent of Work:

The proposed improvements include the full replacement of the bridge and reconstruction of the approach roadway sections. The work on this project will include improvements to the approach roadways that extend approximately 206 feet to the west of the bridge and approximately 234 feet to the east of the bridge. The resulting total project length is approximately 495 feet. The proposed bridge will consist of four concrete box beams with a concrete deck and steel bridge railings. The proposed bridge will be widened from 24 feet to 28 feet to provide two 11-foot-wide travel lanes (one in each direction) and 3-foot-wide shoulders on both sides of the bridge. By widening the bridge, shoulders are provided for improved bicycle accommodation and accessibility and the proposed bridge will be shifted 1 foot to the north which betters the sight distance at the west approach roadway curve. The proposed bridge will also be lengthened, from 25 feet to 55 feet, and the above-ground portion of the west abutment removed. In lengthening the bridge and removing this part of the west abutment, the waterway channel below will be widened which decreases the flood elevation and allows for better environmental access and habitat for endangered species.

Environmental Impacts

There are no negative environmental, cultural resource, nor community impacts anticipated for this project, and coordination with the appropriate agencies will be provided throughout the process.

BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT NO. 607678 JACKSONVILLE STAGE ROAD (ROUTE 8A) OVER THE WEST BRANCH BROOK

Right of Way

There are very minor Right-Of-Way (ROW) impacts associated with the utilities on Town-owned property, with the exception of one temporary service utility pole to maintain utility service to the abutting residential property.

Traffic Management

Phased or staged construction is proposed to complete this project. The traffic management approach to be implemented during the bridge reconstruction will be for one alternating travel lane to serve both directions of travel on Jacksonville Stage Road by means of a temporary traffic signal. A detour route will be implemented and utilized only for necessary, limited overnight full bridge closures.

Project Status and Schedule

The bridge project is at the 25% Highway Bridge Sketch Plan design stage. Comments from this Public Hearing will be taken into consideration to the maximum extent possible.

Project Cost

The estimated total construction cost is approximately \$6,000,000.
