How did we get here?

April 2017

Bridge Inspection noted Advanced Deterioration and Deficiencies for Structure **October** 2018

Emergency Substructure Repairs **July** 2021

Bridge Replacement project re-assigned to MassDOT Design-Build Section

September 2021

MassDOT Pre 25% Design Scoping Site Visit and Coordination Meeting with Federal Highway Administration

February 2023

25% Base Technical Concept Design Submitted





Why was this project initiated?

Project Area





Project Background

- Structure has reached 60 years of service life: current condition = Structurally Deficient
- Deck in Serious Condition; Emergency Repairs to Substructure in 2018
- Substandard vertical clearance (less than 16'-6" minimum)
- Lack of pedestrian and bicycle facilities
- 2017 Alternatives Analysis Report to evaluate:
 - Cross-section requirements
 - Rte. 111 capacity and current/future operations
 - Bicycle/pedestrian connectivity
- Overall GOAL = Route 111 Improvements
 - Step 1 replace bridge ← this project
 - Step 2 roadway improvements at approaches to bridge (future project)

What do we want to accomplish?

Project Goals

- Structurally Deficient Bridge | Replace Bridge
- **Geometry Enhancements** | Improve Vertical and Horizontal Clearances
 - Improved horizontal clearance
 - \checkmark Allow for future widening of I-495
 - ✓ Improve substandard pier protection
 - Improved vertical clearance
 - ✓ Satisfy MIN clearance requirements

Complete Streets Accommodations | Provide facilities for Pedestrians and Cyclists

- Future roadway improvements will connect to facilities on bridge
 - Improve safety and connectivity for cyclists and pedestrians
 - ✓ Per Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Provide ADA compliant facilities





What is the Proposed Alternative?

Proposed Alternative Overview

- Replace 5-span structure with 2-span structure
 - 75-year Design Life
 - Larger opening for future widening and improvements along I-495
- Structure width
 - Accommodate 2 lanes of traffic in each direction for Route 111
 - Add shared use path and sidewalk for cyclists/pedestrians
- Maintain signalized intersections
 - Proposed work will match-up with existing conditions
- Future Route 111 roadway improvement project
 - Extend shared use path and sidewalk along Route 111 at approaches to bridge
 - Provide improved mobility and connectivity for all users throughout area



Proposed Alternative – Bridge Replacement

• Full bridge replacement

• 75-year Design Life



Add shared use path and sidewalk • 2 lanes of travel in each direction



Proposed Alternative – Bridge Replacement

- 2-span structure
- Improved span configuration

- Improved Horizontal Clearances
- Improved Vertical Clearances





Proposed Delivery Method: Design Build

- Design-Build Best Value procurement
 - Short-List Best Qualified Teams
 - Shorten project duration
 - Promote innovation
- MassDOT's contract with the Design Builder will stipulate requirements for traffic management while also providing the Design Builder flexibility to develop their own approach to staging





How will your property be impacted?

Right of Way (ROW) discussion – 25% Design

- Responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of a project.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the ROW Bureau or consultants representing MassDOT.
- Procedures must comply with state and federal regulations governing the acquisition process.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
 - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended.
- Fee takings, permanent easements, and/or temporary construction easements may be required.







Utility Relocations and Impacts

- Existing overhead wires along south side of Route 111
 - Bridge area \rightarrow utility poles/overhead wires relocated further to the south
 - Approaches to bridge \rightarrow remain in existing alignment
- Utilities carried by bridge (gas, fiber-optic, telephone, lighting)
 - Existing utilities are along south side of existing bridge
 - Final condition \rightarrow relocate utilities to north side of proposed bridge structure
- Maintain CCTV camera and lights for I-495 during construction and final condition.
 - Provide power to CCTV camera from temporary utility pole
 - Provide power to light poles on I-495





How will the road user be affected?

Construction Impacts

- **Staged Construction (3 Stages)**
 - No detours required

Travel Lane Impacts

Travel lanes realigned with lane reductions during construction

Ramp Impacts

- Ramp access maintained during all stages -- on/off traffic operations unchanged
- No diversion of regional traffic onto local streets
- All work can be completed within State ROW

- Wetlands Protection Act (WPA) No Notice of Intent (NOI) Required
 MassDOT Bridge Exemptions Apply
- Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) No Environmental Notification Form (ENF) Required
 - MassDOT Bridge Exemptions Apply
- United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) General Permit and Water Quality Certificate (WQC) not required based on proposed work and limits
