








What do we want to accomplish?

Project Goals

- Upgrade aging Short Street bridge:
 - Provide minimal maintenance structure with 75-year design life
 - Provide code compliant traffic safety features
 - Provide Shared Use Path over bridge
- Improve connectivity to Spicket River Greenway
- Stormwater drainage upgrades








What alternatives were considered?

Bridge Alternatives Considered

- Superstructure Replacement
 - Replace beams, bridge deck, sidewalks, concrete railings, etc.
 - Retain existing concrete foundations (built in 1938)
 - Not favorable to widening bridge
- Full Bridge Replacement
 - Complete replacement of entire bridge
 - Allows bridge widening
 - Restarts the clock on 75-year design life








What is the preferred alternative?

Preferred Alternative

- Full Replacement of Short Street Bridge
 - Widen bridge from 50-ft to 64-ft
 - Will include 10-ft wide Shared Use Path on west side of roadway
 - Span length to match existing due to Erving and Maple Street at approaches
 - Bridge will consist of:
 - Spread footing abutments founded on bedrock
 - Concrete box beams with concrete deck
 - Concrete bridge railings
 - Striped travel lanes, shoulders, parking lane
- Improvements to ADA ramps and crosswalks at bridge approaches


= 10-FT SHARED USE PATH WITH 4-FT BUFFER


= 8-FT PARKING LANE

= 7-FT SIDEWALK









Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) discussion 25% Design Public Hearing

- The City of Lawrence is responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of this project.
 - Fee takings, permanent easements and/or temporary construction easements may be required.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the City of Lawrence or consultants representing the responsible agency.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
- Preliminary ROW drawings will be available at https://www.mass.gov/event/lawrence-bridge- <u>replacement-I-04-012-short-street-over-spicket-river-04-30-2025</u> for public review and comment.

At this stage of design, the Right of Way process has not been finalized. This meeting is an opportunity for the public to comment on any impacts to properties.






What is the construction approach?

Construction Approach

- Short Street will be fully closed during construction
 - Vehicular traffic detoured onto adjacent roadways
 - Pedestrian & Bicycle traffic detoured utilizing the Greenway
- Erving Avenue will remain open during construction
 - Reduced width of travel lanes
 - Temporary Parking restrictions
 - · Potential for short term closures for selective construction activities
- Maple Street will remain open to local traffic during construction
- Spicket River Greenway will remain open during construction
 - Greenway detour around construction staging / barriers
- Access to all abutting properties will be maintained throughout construction
- Expected Construction Duration = approx. 18 months (Jan. 2027 Jul. 2028)
