Why was this project initiated?

Existing Issues

- Bridge built around 1900 and closed to vehicular traffic in 1998, due to structural deterioration.
- Limited bicycle/pedestrian accommodation along approaches.
- Substandard vertical clearance over MBTA tracks.

What do we want to accomplish?

Project Goals

- Replace Structurally Deficient Bridge
- Improve Limited Pedestrian / Bike Accommodation
- Increase Substandard Clearance over MBTA Tracks





Project Cost and Funding

- We estimate the total construction cost is approximately \$2.6 million which will come from:
 - Non-Federally Aided District Maintenance funds.







What alternatives were considered?

Alternatives Considered

- Alternative 1: No Build
- Alternative 2: Repair
 Existing Bridge
- Alternative 3: Demolition
 Only
- Alternative 4: Replace with Pedestrian Bridge
 (Preferred)







What is the preferred alternative?

Preferred Alternative – Satisfies Project Goals

- Remove existing bridge and install prefabricated steel truss.
- Reuse existing granite block abutments.
- Add cast-in-place concrete
 cap to the abutments to
 accommodate the
 proposed superstructure.





Proposed Design (Based on 25% Submission)

Proposed Construction Approach:

- Bridge closed during construction to all pedestrian and vehicular traffic. 1-year closure starting in 2025 is anticipated.
- Re-use existing abutments.
- Concrete caps cast on top of the abutments to accommodate the proposed superstructure.
- Install prefabricated bridge. Assemble truss on-site.
- Minimal disruption to MBTA operations.
 Work on or over the rail will take place on nights or weekends.









Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) discussion **25% Design Public Hearing**

- Town of Natick and MassDOT are responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of this project.
 - Fee takings, permanent easements and/or temporary construction easements may be required. Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the Town of Natick, MassDOT ROW
- \bullet Bureau or WSP.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
- Preliminary ROW drawings will be available at the Natick Town Hall for public review and comment. ۲

At this stage of design, the Right of Way process has not been finalized. This meeting is an opportunity for the public to comment on any impacts to properties.





How will bicyclists and pedestrians be impacted?

Pedestrian Detour

- Bridge closed to all traffic during construction.
- Reopen bridge to bicycles and pedestrians at end of bridge construction period.
- Two detour options are shown which are 0.3 and 0.4 miles long.







What are the environmental, cultural resource, and comunity impacts?

Environmental Permitting

- Not federally funded, therefore no NEPA or MEPA filing (environmental regulations).
- No wetland resource areas (rivers/streams) within the project limits.
- Section 106 (historical regulation) review not required.
