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



# **Project Basics**

- Reconstruction of Main Street in downtown Northampton from building face to building face
- The project extends approximately 0.4 miles from:
  - West of the intersection of Elm and West Streets
  - East to the intersection of Market and Hawley Streets
- All intersections within the extents are included in the project






# Why was this project initiated?

# **Safety Issues**

- MassDOT identified high crash location
- Confusion over travel lanes
- Poor visibility at crossings
- Lack of accessibility
- No dedicated space for cyclists





# Additional Considerations

- Accessibility and waiting space for public transit
- Attract business
  investment
- No designated space for loading
- Planting areas for trees
  not sufficient
- Subsurface utilities need improvements







# What do we want to accomplish?

# Goal 1: Improve Safety and Access for All

- Narrow the roadway
- Delineate travel lanes and crossings
- Improve visibility with geometry changes and lighting
- Improve accessibility
- Provide dedicated space for people on bikes





# Goal 2: Promote a Vibrant and Attractive Downtown


- Widen sidewalks
- Support businesses with space for:
  - Outdoor displays
  - Outdoor dining
  - Additional bench seating
- Provide flexible curbside space





## Goal 3: Create a Functional, Enduring, and Sustainable Streetscape



# **Alternatives**

- Four (4) alternatives were presented to the public in April 2021
- They varied by number of travel lanes and configurations of parking and bike lanes
- They were evaluated through criteria aligned with the project's goals
- Public was surveyed on importance of each criteria and ranking of each alternative


## I 2021 s of parking and bike lanes oject's goals ranking of each alternative





# What is the preferred alternative?

Preferred Three vehicle lanes with expanded sidewalks, separated bike **Alternative** lanes, and mix of parallel and angled parking





## **Flex Zones** Timed zones for both loading and pick-up/drop-off or parking





# **Public Parking**

### How is parking changing?

- 130 total existing on-street spaces in Main Street project area today
- 57 on-street spaces removed
- 73 total proposed on-street spaces after reconstruction  $\bullet$
- 4 flex zones added for loading, parking, pick-up / drop-off  $\bullet$

### How is parking remaining the same?

- 400 additional on-street parking spaces within a 5-minute walk of Main Street
- 1,000 additional off-street spaces in public lots and garages



# Sidewalk & Trees


- Wider sidewalks for easier travel and more amenity space
- Some tree preservation. Most trees removed due to poor health or location
- Significant new tree planting
- Increased soil volume with:
  - Connected trench
  - Structural soil and/or soil cells





# **Bus Stops**

- Clarified space for bus queuing at Pulaski Park, Masonic Street, and Court House stops
- Additional space for people waiting on the sidewalk
- Waiting areas are 8' deep for accessible bus entry/exit
- Bike lanes directed behind waiting areas

# Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) Discussion – 25% Design

- The City of Northampton is responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public and private land for design, construction, and implementation of this project
  - Current design plans show 3 fee takings and 12 temporary construction easements
  - The ROW status may change as the design progresses
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the City of Northampton.
  - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79
- Preliminary ROW plans will be available for public review and comment at: *City of Northampton Office of Planning & Sustainability*  210 Main Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor *Northampton, MA*

# **Preliminary Environmental Review and Permitting**

## **Historic**:

- No impact to buildings
- Limited right-of-way takings of land ullet

## Water:

- No wetlands impacts
- Improving stormwater conditions  $\bullet$

## **Endangered/Threatened Species:**

- No critical habitat in project zone  $\bullet$
- Endangered or threatened species, such as northern long-eared bat, within the County •

Permits generally to be completed as part of 75% Design phase



# **Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act Review**

- Public shade tree removal above threshold of 5 trees ullet
- Project includes Environmental Justice areas  $\bullet$
- Environmental Notification Form will be filed followed by Environmental Impact Report ullet
- Both have a public comment period of 37 days ullet
