








# Why was this project initiated

# The River Street Bridge: a Multimodal Connection

- One lane of traffic in each direction with sidewalks
- Carries MBTA bus routes
- Carries four major utilities
- Supports Amtrak electrified wires (catenary) and protective barrier
- Inspection and repairs have been an ongoing challenge
- Design for a replacement bridge launched *prior* to May 2022 public safety closure







# A Closed Bridge: a Community Concern

- May 2022 bridge closed for public safety and detours in place
- Traffic congestion issues:
  - Austin Street
  - Gordon Avenue
  - Business Street
  - Summer Street
- Adjustments to MBTA Bus Routes




# Fully Replace the River Street Bridge

- Provide a reliable connection for all modes
- Provide a modern structure:
  - Easy to inspect
  - Easy to maintain
- 75–100-year design life

# What is the preferred alternative?


### **Dismissed Alternatives**

Alternative	Reason for Dismissal
Repairs only to the existing structure	Does not address long-term reliability Does not address inspection/maintenance challenges
Installing a crossing of the Northeast Corridor elsewhere	Does not align to the existing street network Could draw traffic onto residential streets
Use of a prefabricated bridge to speed up construction	Depth-of-structure on prefabricated bridges does not provide adequate clearance over the catenary
Increase in number of lanes on/width of the River Street Bridge	Impacts to abutting properties  Does not match abutting sections of River  Street




# Proposed Replacement Bridge – Typical Section

- One lane in each direction
- One sidewalk on both sides
- One, 1-foot shoulder on both sides
- Concrete deck on steel beams







# Proposed Permanent Utility/Construction Phase Pedestrian/Cycle Bridge



### Proposed Typical Sections of River Street Utility Bridge




RIVER STREET PEDESTRIAN RAMP TYPICAL SECTION



# A Consistent Connection for Cyclists and Pedestrians




- A direct path will be maintained throughout construction:
  - On the existing bridge from now to winter 2025/26
  - •On the utility bridge from winter 2025/26 to spring 2027
  - •On the new structure after spring 2027





How are the road users affected?

### Full Vehicle Detour from Winter 2025/26 to Winter 2026/27



## **Detour Monitoring**



- During construction:
  - Regular communication with area community groups, elected officials etc.
  - Replacement of damaged detour signs as needed
  - Placement of additional signs as appropriate
  - Routine checks of changeable message signs to ensure correct operation/alignment to traffic.
