A Design Public Hearing will be held to present the design for the proposed Reconstruction of Canton Street Project in Westwood, MA.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this hearing is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Reconstruction of Canton Street Project. All views and comments submitted in response to the hearing will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

PROPOSAL: The proposed project extends along Canton Street from the East Street Rotary to the intersection with University Avenue (1.9 miles) and consists of constructing a shared-use path along the east side of the roadway and a sidewalk along the west side of the roadway, with high-visibility crossing opportunities, -in accordance with applicable design guides. Bicyclists are intended to use the shared-use path for travel and pedestrians may walk along either side. The facilities will drop to the roadway grade over the existing bridge over the railroad tracks. These facilities will provide connections to the Downey Elementary School, the Route 128/University Park MBTA/Amtrak Station, nearby retail and restaurants, and the adjacent Currier Reservation conservation area. The Project will also incorporate traffic calming measures in an effort to reduce vehicular speeds along Canton Street, a new stormwater system, water main replacement, and relocated overhead utilities.

A secure right-of-way is necessary for this project. Acquisitions in fee and permanent or temporary easements may be required. The **Town of Westwood** is responsible for acquiring all needed rights in private or public lands. MassDOT's policy concerning land acquisitions will be presented <u>in</u> the hearing.

# Design Public Hearing Canton Street Improvements, Westwood

#### What is happening?

A Design Public Hearing for the proposed Canton Street Improvements Project in Westwood, MA will be held at the location below. A shared-use path for pedestrian and bicyclist use will be constructed along the east side of Canton Street between the East Street Rotary and the University Avenue intersection (approximately 1.9 miles). A sidewalk will be constructed along the west side of Canton Street for pedestrian use. The bicyclist facility will lower to the roadway grade over the existing bridge over the railroad tracks. This Project will provide safer accommodations, with high-visibility crossing opportunities for pedestrians and bicyclists.

#### How will this affect you?

These facilities will provide connections to the Downey Elementary School, the Route 128/University Park MBTA/Amtrak Station, nearby retail and restaurants, and the Currier Reservation Conservation Area. The Project will also incorporate traffic calming measures in an effort to reduce vehicular speeds along Canton Street.








# **Cross Section Alternatives Analysis**



Alternative 1 (On-Road Bicycle Facility)










### Preferred Alternative Canton Terrace to Forbes Road





### Preferred Alternative Typical Cross Section






### Preferred Alternative Typical Section






### Preferred Alternative Forbes Road to Cushing Road






### Preferred Alternative Cushing Road to Everett Street








### Preferred Alternative Everett Street to Hemlock Drive






### Preferred Alternative Hemlock Drive to 646 Canton Street






### Preferred Alternative 646 Canton Street to 725 Canton Street









# What is the construction approach?

# **Phased Construction Approach**

- Access to businesses and residences
  will be maintained at all times with shortduration closures for driveway
  reconstruction
- Short-duration off-peak temporary lane closures are anticipated
- One-lane alternating traffic under police/flagger direction
- MassDOT full-time Resident Engineer to oversee contractor
