

# How will your property be impacted?

## Right of Way (ROW) Discussion – 25% Design

- Responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of a project
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the Town of Whately and the MassDOT ROW Bureau
- Procedures must comply with state and federal regulations governing the acquisition process
  - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79
  - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under the Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended
- Fee takings, permanent easements, and/or temporary construction easements are required



## Why was this project initiated?

## **Existing Issues**

- Aged roadway with deteriorated pavement that requires heavy maintenance
- Substandard guardrail
- Utility poles / trees / slopes located within the roadside clear zone
- Increased travel speeds
- Lack of shoulder widths to provide space for emergency response vehicles
- No defined bicycle or pedestrian space
- Deteriorated drainage pipes and structures
- Erosion at culvert outfalls
- No stormwater treatment for paved surface runoff

## What do we want to accomplish?

## Existing Issues – Proposed Actions


- Aged roadway with deteriorated pavement that requires heavy maintenance
  - Reconstruct pavement & base layers
- Substandard guardrail
  - Replace guardrail with new rail systems
- Utility poles / trees / slopes located within the roadside clear zone
  - Relocate poles and regrade side slopes further away from the pavement
- Increased travel speeds
  - Install new signage and pavement markings for increased driver awareness





## Existing Issues – Proposed Actions


- Lack of shoulder widths to provide space for emergency response vehicles
  - Provide uniform shoulders with pavement markings for separation and to alert drivers
- No defined bicycle or pedestrian space
  - Provide uniform shoulders with pavement markings for separation and to alert drivers
- Deteriorated drainage pipes and structures
  - Replace or rehabilitate pipes and structures
- Erosion at culvert outfalls
  - Construct outfall protection BMP's
- No treatment for paved surface runoff
  - Construct deep-sump catch basins, grassed swales and stone check dams
































