

# Eliot Bridge Preservation Public Information Meeting

## What is happening?

The purpose of this meeting is to provide the public with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed Eliot Street Bridge Preservation project. All views and comments made at the meeting will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

## How will this affect you?

The project is scheduled to begin in Spring 2024 and will last approximately two years. Lane shifts will be present on the bridge during construction with temporary barriers in place to direct traffic through the work zones in order to replace the median barrier and lighting. Pedestrian detours will be in place throughout construction to allow for repairs to the bridge railings and sidewalks. Detours will also be utilized in the navigable channel in order to perform concrete patching to the underside of the bridge. The contractor will stage construction so that the bridge remains open to pedestrians, bikes, vehicles and boats throughout the duration of the project utilizing the above-mentioned detours and lane shifts.
