










Project Context









Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) discussion

- Responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of a project.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the ROW Bureau or consultants representing ulletMassDOT.
- Procedures must comply with state and federal regulations governing the acquisition process. ●
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
 - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended.
- Fee takings, permanent easements, and/or temporary construction easements may be required. ۲

Why was this project initiated?

- Built in 1964, rehabilitated in 1984
- Structurally deficient bridge requires superstructure replacement
- Lack of good infrastructure to support multimodal movement
- Inaccessible (non-ADA compliant) and uninviting pedestrian accommodation
- Impacts on environmental and cultural resources (Muddy River, Charlesgate Park, Back Bay Fens)



What do we want to accomplish?

Purpose and Scope

- The purpose of this project is to restore the existing Bowker Overpass over I-90/ MBTA & CSX/ ullet**Ipswich Street**
- Scope of Work \bullet
 - Replace the superstructure of the Bowker Overpass over I-90/ MBTA & CSX/ Ipswich Street
 - Reconstruct the Bowker Overpass and Boylston Street intersection
 - Remove the existing deficient off ramp structure over Muddy River
 - Widen the bridge structure to provide pathways along Charlesgate West



Project Goals

- Eliminate and rebuild deficient bridge infrastructure
- Significantly improve (safety/comfort/ease) pedestrian and bicyclist connectivity
- Enhance safety ۲
- **Additional Benefits**
 - Enhance ADA compliance for all pedestrian accommodations
 - Reconnect surrounding greenway/park systems (Emerald Necklace, Commonwealth Avenue Mall)
 - Reduce environmental impacts on the Muddy River and cultural resources (Charlesgate park, Back Bay Fens)
 - Strengthen multimodal connections for people through and across roadway infrastructure to surrounding parkland
 - Improve Traffic Patterns
 - Prepare the site to receive further park space improvements, by others.



























How will road users, bicyclists, and pedestrians be impacted?

Temporary Construction Impacts

- Road users ullet
 - Traffic over the bridge will be maintained throughout construction
 - Drivers can anticipate temporary lane closures and rolling roadblocks on I-90 (MassPike)
 - Parking restrictions and nighttime roadway closures on Ipswich Street
- Railroad \bullet
 - Impacts and foul time to be limited to non-revenue MBTA hours
- **Pedestrians** •
 - During construction, one sidewalk will be kept open to pedestrians. Signage will be installed to help pedestrians navigate the project area
- Cyclists •
 - During construction, cyclists will be permitted to travel through the area as they normally would, either riding on the road or walking their bikes on the sidewalk


