



# Why was this project initiated?

## **Project Goals**

- Connect to 10.5-mile
   Northern Strand Off Road Trail through
   Everett, Malden, Revere,
   Saugus, and Lynn
- Improve connections to resources and destinations around the City of Lynn and Lynn/Nahant shore
- Improve transportation access and accessibility for bicycle users and pedestrians





## What do we want to accomplish?

## **Project Scope**

- Construction of a two-way Separated Bike Lane (SBL) and Shared-Use Path (SUP)
  - Two-way SBL from the terminus of the off-road section of the Northern Strand along
     Western Avenue and along Market Square
  - Two-way SBL along South Common Street to Market Street
  - SUP along first block of Market Street
  - Two-way SBL along Market Street to Broad Street
  - SUP through Carroll Parkway
  - Two-way SBL along the Lynnway to the Nahant rotary
  - SUP along the Nahant rotary and Nahant Road
  - Total of 1.92 miles of two-way Separated Bike Lane and Shared-Use Path




## Western Ave through Market Square Two-Way Separated Bike Lane






#### Plan View: Northern Strand Off-Road Terminus along Western Avenue to Market Square








#### South Common Street Two-Way Separated Bike Lane




























## Plan View: Market Street at the Lynnway






### The Lynnway to Nahant Road Two-Way Separated Bike Lane and Shared-Use Path











Plan View: The Lynnway to Nahant Road

# How will your property be impacted?

#### Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) discussion

- Responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of a project.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from their municipality
- Procedures must comply with state and federal regulations governing the acquisition process.
  - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
  - If project receives federal funds, property owners are further protected under Title III of the Real Property Act of 1970, as amended.
- Fee takings, permanent easements, and/or temporary construction easements may be required.
- Plans are located at Lynn City Hall and Nahant Town Hall





What are the environmental, cultural resource, and community impacts?

### **Environmental and Construction Permitting**

All necessary environmental permitting shall be filed prior to advertisement of the project.

#### Permits include:

NEPA – Programmatic Categorical Exclusion

DCR – Access Permit

MWRA – 8(m) Permit

NHPA - Section 106

MA Wetlands Protection Act - Notices of Intent

MA Public Waterfront Act – Chapter 91 License







## What is the construction approach?

#### **Construction Impacts**

#### **During Construction**

- Completed in phases (TBD by Contractor)
- One lane of traffic in each direction to be maintained at all times
- Pedestrian accommodation to be maintained at all times
- Parking restrictions implemented

#### **After Construction**

- Improved pedestrian and bicycle accommodations
- Improved intersections with upgraded traffic signals
- New Pavement Markings and wayfinding signage
- New landscaping and amenities
