Replacement of Bridge M-27-026, Stafford Hollow Road over New England Central Railroad (NECRR) In-person Public Information Meeting

What is happening?

The purpose of this meeting is to provide the pubic with the opportunity to become fully acquainted with the proposed replacement of Bridge M-27-026, Stafford Hollow Road over NECRR. Public comment and concerns are being solicited and will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

How will this affect you?

The proposed project initially consisted of replacement of the timber superstructure. After the initial site visit, a full bridge replacement is now being considered. The project limits extend approximately 200 feet in either direction from the ends of the current bridge. Bicycle and pedestrian facilities do not exist within this area; however, accommodations are currently being considered in the design. Options are also being investigated on routes that may be necessary for a detour during construction.



Why was this project initiated?



Existing Issues

- Structurally deficient bridge with posted weight limits
- Bridge operates as a one-lane bridge due to narrow width
- Lack of safe pedestrian and bicycle accommodations





What do we want to accomplish?

Project Purpose

Bridge Replacement | Replace structurally deficient timber and stone bridge that carries Stafford Hollow Road over New England Central Railroad (NECR)

Roadway Improvement | Eliminate narrow lane width restriction at the bridge

Pedestrian & Cyclist Improvements | Provide safe and accessible facility over NECR












Proposed Design – Stafford Hollow Road Approach

How will bicyclists and pedestrians be impacted?

Pedestrians & Cyclists

- Currently there are no bicycle or pedestrian facilities in this area
- Concept design includes installation of a sidewalk on one side of the bridge
- Concept design adds usable shoulders within the project limits









What is the construction approach?

Construction Impacts

- Good possibility of traffic
 being detoured around the bridge to
 facilitate its removal and
 reconstruction.
- Advance signing will be used to alert the traveling public to the closure and detour route.
- Access to all adjacent residences will be maintained at all times during construction.












Traffic Detour

- Stafford Road (Route 32) to Cedar
 Swamp Road to Peck Brothers Road to Stafford Hollow Road
- Similar detour route was implemented in 2021 for previous bridge repair work
- Advance signing will be used to alert the traveling public to the closure and detour route.
- Access to all adjacent residences will be maintained at all times during construction.







How will your property be impacted?

Preliminary Right of Way (ROW) discussion Public Information Meeting

- MassDOT is responsible for acquiring all necessary rights in public land for design, construction, and implementation of this project.
 - Fee takings, permanent easements and/or temporary construction easements may be required.
- Affected property owners will be contacted by personnel from the MassDOT ROW Bureau or consultants representing the responsible agency.
 - Property owners are protected under Massachusetts General Laws, primarily Chapter 79.
- Preliminary ROW drawings are still being developed and should be available for the 25% design public hearing.

At this stage of design, the Right of Way process has not been finalized. This meeting is an opportunity for the public to comment on any impacts to properties.
