

Project Background

- Replace and rehabilitate eight bridges at the I-90/I-95 interchange in Newton and Weston
- Bridge and roadway safety improvements, increase vertical clearance, and improve seismic resiliency
- Project-type: Design-Build
- Currently 2 yrs into a 4.5 yr total construction duration






Noise Walls

Westbound Barrier




Noise Walls (3)

- Noise analysis conducted per MassDOT's Type I and Type II Noise Abatement Policies and Procedures and the Federal Highway Administration's (FHWA's) guidelines
 - Type I: This project involves substantial alteration of existing highway ramp alignments
 - Analysis determined sound levels exceed MassDOT noise impact criteria and noise abatement is necessary
- In 2022, residents at Benefited Receptor Locations formally voted in favor of constructing noise walls
- Both sides of the noise walls are sound absorptive and should not amplify sounds from trains
- Eastbound noise wall construction: 2025-2026
- Westbound noise wall construction: Late 2027

I-90 Over the MBTA


2025 Construction Operations – I-90 Over MBTA Bridge

- Complete temporary median crossovers for upcoming bridge superstructure replacement
- Preparations for rapid weekend construction
- Reduce I-90 to one lane in each direction for rapid weekend construction operations.
- Replace I-90 westbound and eastbound superstructure over the MBTA railroad
- Remove median crossover and construct permanent bridge barrier





I-90 over MBTA/ Amtrak Bridge Impacts

Rapid Construction Weekends

- Friday May 30 Monday June 2
- Friday June 20 Monday June 23

I-90 Impacts

- Lane reductions: one lane in each direction of I-90 EB & WB
- Construction: 9 p.m. on Friday to 5 a.m. on Monday

Rail Impacts

- Worcester Commuter Rail service between Framingham and South Station
 - Buses will replace the last Commuter Rail trip on Friday and replace all trips on Saturday and Sunday
- Amtrak service along Lake Shore Limited between Boston and Albany
 - Buses will replace last Amtrak trip on Friday, all trips on Saturday and Sunday, and first trip Monday

I-90 Dry Run – Weekend of May 2

- I-90 will be restricted from 3 lanes to 1 lane in each direction beginning 9:00 PM on Friday, May 2
- I-90 will reopen to 3 lanes by 7:00 AM on Saturday, May 3
- If necessary, will be repeated on Saturday May 3 at 9:00 PM to make any adjustments


Commuter Rail Station Impacts

There will be two shuttle routes:


- 1. Framingham, West Natick, Natick Center Wellesley Square, Wellesley Hills, Wellesley Farms, Auburndale to Riverside (with increased GL-D service).
- 2. West Newton, Newtonville, Boston Landing to Kenmore where customers can take GL-B, GL-C, or GL-D.

Lansdowne is a walking diversion to Fenway on GL-D

I-90 Lane Reductions




Anticipated Traffic Impacts




Regional Travel Options

I-90 Mainline Bridges


2025 Anticipated Construction Operations – I-90 Mainline Bridges

- After the Rapid Replacement Weekends, the following traffic shifts will take place:
- Implementation of Stage 1B
 - Early July 2025
 - Shift Ramp P/G traffic on to the new bridge structure
 - I-90 EB remains on the existing bridge while roadway construction takes place to tie existing I-90
 EB to the new I-90 EB configuration
- Implementation of Stage 2A
 - Late July/ Early August 2025
 - Shift I-90 EB traffic on to the new bridge
 - Commence demolition of the existing I-90 EB structure
- Impacts for Stage 1B and 2A
 - Nightly lane closures on I-90 EB and extended lane closures Friday and Saturday nights for pavement and grading work

• I-90 eastbound bridge constructed, traffic to be moved onto new bridge




Phase 2A: I-90 Mainline Bridges

Other Coordination

- MBTA: ensure effective commuter rail operation and passenger access to Riverside
- Coordination with adjacent MassDOT projects
- Emergency services on I-90
- Maintain boater access to the Charles River while communicating certain public safety restrictions during construction
- MassDOT will notify navigation companies (Google Maps, Waze, etc.) at appropriate times



Rapid Weekend Reminders

- If possible, stay away from area during rapid weekends-there will be significant delays
- Seek regional and local alternate routes
- Check Mass511
- Monday morning: leave at normal time to reduce congestion prior to 5am reopening
- MassDOT will be reminding drivers on social media and radio leading up to weekends reminders
