Springfield The "X" Intersection Reconstruction

What is happening?

The Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) will host an upcoming In-Person Public Information Meeting to update the public on the status of the reconstruction of Sumper Avenue at the intersection of Dickinson Street and Belmont Avenue in Springfield, MA. The meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 14, 2025, in the Forest Park Middle School Auditorium at 46 Oakland Street in Springfield, from 6:30 PM - 8:30 PM.

This event will include a formal presentation followed by an opportunity to ask questions and make comments Public input will be reviewed and considered to the maximum extent possible.

How will this affect you?

The public is encouraged to attend this meeting and learn more about the project and provide feedback. There will be information on the project background, the project design, the schedule and construction phasing, early construction activity, public involvement, and next steps. Project improvements include: traffic pattern changes and the addition of transition lanes (i.e. auxiliary lanes), new traffic signals and traffic signal coordination, 5-foot bicycle lanes and widening and reconstruction of sidewalks to shared-use paths, pedestrian facility and accessibility upgrades, bus stop and shelter upgrades, and replacement of street lighting, furnishings, and




Project Background

Project Improvements and Design Overview

- Traffic pattern changes and the addition of transition lanes (i.e. auxiliary lanes)
- New traffic signals and traffic signal coordination
- 5-foot bicycle lanes and widening and reconstruction of sidewalks to shared-use paths
- Pedestrian facility and accessibility upgrades
- Bus stop and shelter upgrades
- Replacement of street lighting, furnishings, and landscaping





Project Design – Vehicular Traffic

The project includes the following changes for vehicular traffic patterns:

- Reconfigure Sumner Avenue, including the addition of turn lanes with vegetated concrete median islands.
- Remove the left turn restriction on Dickinson Street northbound.
- Ormond Street becomes one way northbound.
- Modify the T intersection at Belmont Avenue and Burlington Street to include a pedestrian bump out.
- Reconfigure portions of Belmont Avenue to a oneway road.
- Reconfigure Cliffwood Street with a single left-turn lane and a through-right lane.
- Reverse direction of Cliftwood and Lenox; signalize the Cliftwood/Sumner intersection.





Project Design – Multi-Modal Improvements

The project was designed with a **Complete Streets** approach and includes the following improvements:

- 4 new crosswalks at Sumner Avenue and Cliftwood Street, Belmont Avenue and Burlington Street, and at Ormond Street.
- Enhancing existing crosswalks with higher visibility striping, and by signalizing the Ormond street intersection with signal-controlled pedestrian crossings.
- 2 new pedestrian plazas at Sumner Avenue and Belmont Avenue.
- Transit service enhancements with the addition of 13 new bus shelters.
- Addition of 5-foot, on-street, painted bike lanes on Sumner Avenue and Belmont Avenue, and converting the north and south Sumner Avenue sidewalk to a shared-use path.





Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA), Project Landscaping

- The project was published in the MEPA Environmental Monitor on July 26, 2023: https://eeaonline.eea.state.ma.us/EEA/MEPA -eMonitor/home
- A total of 118 trees are proposed to be planted, yielding a net gain of 57 trees within the project limits.
- The total number of trees preserved increased by 35 trees from the 25% design.



Early Construction Activity

- Comcast utility work, relocation of underground utilities on Sumner Avenue, April – November 2025.
- Baltazar underground utility work on Sumner Avenue; tree removal and pruning in the project limits; April 2025 – Spring 2026.









Requirements During Construction

- Maintain pedestrian, bicycle, vehicle, emergency, school bus, and delivery access during all stages.
- Coordinate reconstruction of commercial and residential driveways with property owners.
- Communicate with businesses, residents, and stakeholder groups, in advance of and during construction.
- Dust control measures will be utilized including wetting agents, truck bed covers, and periodic street cleaning.




