What is the Group Adult Foster Care Program?

The Group Adult Foster Care (GAFC) program provides personal care services to eligible individuals who live in a home setting. Direct care workers employed by a GAFC agency provide personal care services. GAFC helps individuals keep their independence so that they can stay in the community.

Who is Eligible?

- Adults 22 or older who need physical assistance or cueing and supervision with at least one Activity of Daily Living (ADL). An ADL includes bathing, dressing, or mobility.
- Individuals who qualify for MassHealth Standard or CommonHealth.

Program Benefits

- **Personalized Support.** Assistance with ADLs, medication reminders, nursing oversight, and case management.
- **Care Coordination.** A registered nurse and case manager provide oversight and personalized care planning of the GAFC personal care services.
- **Care Delivery.** A direct care aide provides daily physical assistance or cueing and supervision to each GAFC member in the member's home.
