Medfield Package Store Inc. (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, September 25, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05(2), to wit: c.138, §34- Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Carey's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Carey's Compliance Check Field Report dated May 16, 2012; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

- 1. On Wednesday, May 16, 2012 at approximately 4:45 p.m., Investigators Teehan and Carey conducted an investigation of the business operation of Medfield Package Store Inc.
- 2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a six-pack of Budweiser beer for six dollars and fifty cents (\$6.50). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated of 204 CMR 2.05(2), to wit: c.138, §34- Sale or Delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the licensee has been in business since 1935 and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a **WARNING.**
