DECISION

PIZZERIA REGINA OF MEDFORD INC. D/B/A PIZZERIA REGINA
44 STATION LANDING
MEDFORD, MA 02155
LICENSE#: 068000058
VIOLATION DATE: 04/08/2016

Pizzeria Regina of Medford Inc. d/b/a Pizzeria Regina (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, June 21, 2016, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Di Cicco's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Di Cicco's Compliance Check Field Report dated April 8, 2016; and
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.
 - A. Photograph of Room on Licensed Premises; and
 - B. Employees' Sign-In Sheet for Safe Service Alcohol Training.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS

1. On Friday, April 8, 2016, at approximately 5:35 p.m., Investigators Temple and Di Cicco ("Investigators") investigated the business operation of Pizzeria Regina of Medford Inc. d/b/a Pizzeria Regina.


2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, for three dollars and ninety-one cents (\$3.91). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) - Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the Licensee has been in business for ten (10) years and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
