CLARIFICATION

In the Order on Motion for Order Approving Transfer (“Order”) issued in the above-referenced docket on January 14, 2003, the Cable Television Division (“Cable Division”) of the Department of Telecommunications and Energy approved transfer of control of the cable television franchise (the “License”) in the City of Cambridge from AT&T Corp. to Comcast Corporation.¹ While the Order taken as a whole establishes this result, the Ordering Paragraph may be interpreted as transferring the License itself, rather than control of the License. Since the transfer of a license is accomplished through a corporate transaction, the role of an issuing authority is to approve or deny that transaction. In the case where an issuing authority fails to

¹ Upon consummating the merger between AT&T Broadband and Comcast Corporation, the newly-created entity was named Comcast Corporation rather than AT&T Comcast Corporation as originally planned. The name change does not affect the ultimate control of the license at issue.

comply with a lawful order, the Cable Division assumes this role. By this Order, we reaffirm our approval of the transfer of control of the License in the City of Cambridge from AT&T Corp. to Comcast Corporation.
