 - o How are supervisors classified?
 - Supervisors are very important, especially in reinforcing training i.e., supported decision making. Such a decentralized workforce.
 - Frontline supervisors: staff who supervise DSP and also engage in direct support: providing oversight, advice, career supports to those DSPs.
 - When will the next survey will be done? Some of the drivers may be different.
 - 2022 report is coming up in a few weeks. MA only participates every other year.
 - O Rep. Khan shared about the "hospital at home" movement across the country to have hospitals work on moving people out of the hospital back home and provide support in the home. Instead of nursing home or rehab, they are sent home with hospital support with an at-home physician model.
 - MA has 5 hospitals participating: nurse practitioners, food being delivered home for example.
 - Higher increased need of workforce at all levels.
 - How does this affect the home and communitybased services related to reimbursement rates compared to hospital rates?
 - o Budget coming up: chat about what Rep. Khan could file as a budget amendment around DSPs.
