Meeting Notes Summary:

1. Welcome, Roll Call, Approval of May Minutes:

• The May meeting minutes were unanimously approved.

2. Guest Speakers: Barbara L'Italien, Tatum Pritchard, and Rick Glassman from the Disability Law Center (DLC) on Voting Access for Individuals with Disabilities:

• Accessible Voting:

- Massachusetts now offers the most accessible remote voting system in the nation, allowing all voters, including those with disabilities, to vote by mail.
- Thanks to advocacy by DLC and partners, voters with disabilities can use assistive technology to vote electronically via platforms like Democracy Live, which has been positively received.
- Voters who encounter issues at the polls can access emergency absentee ballots, with similar accommodations available for those who cannot use standard print ballots.

Question: How many states currently offer electronic voting?

o Answer: The number is still in the minority, though Massachusetts has been a leader in implementing electronic voting for federal elections.

Question: If I currently vote by absentee ballot but want to switch to electronic voting, how do I do that?

 Answer: Contact your local election official or apply online through the Secretary of State's accessible form to receive accommodations for accessible remote voting.

Question: If I opt for electronic remote voting but decide to go to the polls, what happens?

o Answer: You are still able to vote in person at the polls.

• Polling Place Accessibility:

- o The aging Automark machines in polling sites need replacement, and there is concern about maintaining uniformity in the new equipment across municipalities.
- DLC is advocating for standardized voting equipment and ballot design statewide to ensure accessibility and consistency.
- The DLC and BSCB are assessing potential replacement models and pushing for uniformity across the state.
- o An <u>online accessibility survey</u> has been created to gather information on accessibility issues at polling locations.

Question: Does the DLC recommend a specific voting device?

 Answer: While DLC evaluated devices from three manufacturers, Democracy Live stood out as the most user-friendly transition for voters familiar with Automark.

• Legislative Advocacy:

- DLC supports legislation (House 701, Senate 2799) to shift the responsibility of auditing polling place accessibility to the Secretary of State's office, requiring audits every four years.
- Despite federal and state accessibility laws, enforcement remains insufficient, which this legislation aims to address.

Question: Aren't there already federal regulations on accessibility?

o Answer: Yes, but there is insufficient oversight, and this legislation seeks to ensure proactive enforcement and accountability.

• Remote Participation in Local Government:

The shift to remote public hearings during COVID-19 increased accessibility, but many municipalities are reverting to in-person meetings. Efforts are ongoing to maintain hybrid options for continued participation by people with disabilities and others facing barriers. BCIL, along with Common Cause and other organizations, is advocating for House Bill H 4771, which promotes universal design and broader participation in local government, benefiting people with disabilities, those with childcare responsibilities, and others.
