

Dock Site Profile Data

Geography – landing site, market area, site description, multi-modal access

Demographics/Demand – population, labor force, median income, journey to work

Development – potential for growing demand in the next 1 to 5 years

Site Conditions – existing pier, ramp, and floats + proposed/funded designs

Salem Ferry Terminal

support improvements to existing service + pilot limited weekend service to Harbor Islands

Blossom St Pier (Lynn)

implement business plan, support expanded service + pilot limited weekend service to Harbor Islands

Winthrop Ferry Dock

support improvements to existing service

Fallon Pier at Columbia Point (Dorchester)

study new service

(Quincy)

study permanent regular service + study potential as Harbor Island Gateway site

Potential for Future Study

Private Ferry Service

- Service to Provincetown from Boston and Plymouth
- Wynn Casino water shuttle (2019)

Medium Term

Sites with existing barrier that may be overcome in 5 years

+ each site will get a set of suggested next steps

Long Term

Sites where changes to site infrastructure, population density, and vessel speeds may lead to potential demand



Water Transportation Study Process Next Steps

with models for estimated ridership demand

3 routes

with detailed market and feasibility analysis Model congestion mitigation and reduced emissions
