

How the GMAC Consultants Can Help in 2025



The role of the GMAC consultants is to support the achievement of the GMAC's goals by:

- (a) Providing technical expertise on topics related to the ESMPs
- (b) Providing information regarding best practices for grid modernization in other states
- (c) Facilitating discussion of key topics among the GMAC members
- (d) Summarizing activities related to ESMPs, as requested by GMAC
- (e) Providing observations on ESMP issues (and activities related to ESMPs, as requested by GMAC)
- (f) Providing recommendations on ESMP issues (and related activities by GMAC request)
- (g) Supporting GMAC strategic planning efforts

GMAC 2025 Goals



Review from the October GMAC Meeting

Building foundational knowledge on distribution system planning, investments, and activities. This will include:

- Continued stakeholder engagement and informational materials.
- Collaboration with the EDCs.
- Ongoing monitoring of ESMP phases at the DPU.
- Ongoing monitoring and updates on related distribution system dockets and working groups (Ex: ARR, Service Quality Reports, EV investment plans, LTSPP, CIPs, Joint Working Group, CESAG, Interagency Rates Working Group).
- Development of a work plan beyond 2025 and leading up to the next draft ESMPs.

Activities in 2025 will:

- Feature productive dialogue and collaboration, and develop shared understanding
- Increase transparency and stakeholder engagement in broader grid planning activities

• Prepare the Council for more in-depth collaboration in 2026 and 2027

GMAC Meetings and Activities



GMAC's key statutory objectives:

- Encourage least-cost investments that will facilitate the achievement of multiple planning goals
- Increase transparency and stakeholder engagement in the grid planning process
- Review and provide recommendations on ESMPs

GMAC meetings will be used to pursue these goals by encouraging:

- EDCs to share information and answer questions about ESMPs and related issues
- GMAC members to provide their perspectives and views to the EDCs on ESMPs and related issues
- GMAC members and EDCs to discuss, collaborate, and develop shared understandings
- GMAC members to identify opportunities to educate public stakeholders about ESMPs and related issues
- GMAC members to monitor and discuss related ESMP and distribution system planning activities
- GMAC members to develop and refine recommendations on ESMPs

Draft Activity Tracker




The consultants developed an Excel workbook to serve as a central location for tracking GMAC and ESMP
