<u>Nallie Pastures, Dracut - \$10,000</u> - to purchase a mower, trailer, and freezers for their pastured poultry operation.

<u>Golden Hour Farms, Berkley - \$10,000</u> - to purchase a utility box truck with vinyl wrap to increase trucking capacity for supply sourcing, product delivery, and mobile advertising for their pick-your-own tulip and wholesale greenhouse plant operations.
