A Federally funded Hazard Mitigation Grant Program

What is BRIC?

FEMA's Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) program is a new, nationally competitive hazard mitigation funding opportunity designed to replace the former Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) program. The BRIC program was developed to support communities in building capacity, providing innovative solutions, encouraging partnerships, enabling large projects, and maintaining flexibility for state-of-the-art solutions. Through BRIC, communities can make proactive investments in community resilience, infrastructure projects, and protect vital community lifelines. BRIC Projects Must:

- Adequately mitigate current hazards by increasing the level of protection above what currently exists.
- Include a detailed plan for obtaining required permitting.
- Demonstrate cost-effectiveness (utilizing Benefit Cost Analysis software v 6.0).
- Include documentation of local commitment to the project.
- Be consistent with state and local hazard mitigation plans.
- Promote utilization of nature-based approaches and provide environmental benefits.
- Focus on critical infrastructure.



All potential Applicants must submit a Statement of Interest (SOI) to MEMA by October 16, 2020



Capability and Capacity Building (C&CB)

The BRIC program will also fund activities which build capacity and capacity to successfully implement hazard mitigation. These projects will result in a tangible mitigation project that will increase resiliency to natural hazards and climate change. These activities can include:

- Building Code Activities
- Promoting Partnerships
- Project Scoping
- Mitigation Planning
- Planning Related Activities
- Hazard Mitigation Plans

KEY DATES

Statement of Interest (SOI) Deadline: 10/16/2020 - Statements of Interest are submitted via the MEMA website to determine basic eligibility and to initiate access to FEMA GO's Application System.

Invitations for Full Applications in FEMA GO: 10/16/2020 - SOI's will be screened for basic eligibility. SOI's which pass the screening will be invited to submit a full BRIC Application by the state deadline.

FEMA GO Registration: 11/2/2020 - Sub-applicants invited to submit full BRIC Applications should register at sam.gov and FEMA GO no later than this date.

Benefit-Cost Analysis: 11/24/2020 - Sub-applicants are required to submit a BCA to MEMA staff by this date. Technical assistance and feedback on BCA's is available on a first come-first served basis. Subapplicants are encouraged to submit a draft BCA as early as possible.

Full FEMA GO BRIC Application Submission Deadline: 12/11/2020 - Full applications must be submitted through FEMA GO no later than this date. This is a final deadline and there is no opportunity to make changes or additions to your application after this date.
