Michelle Corbin	Can you please go into examples of indirect cost?	Preliminary Disaster Assessments, Office Supplies certain office supplies may not be eligible at the onset of a disaster, but were necessary for a specific project, or for response to the incident.
Michelle Papanicolaou	When you state that you submit Management Costs in Category Z and not on Grants Portal where does one access that software and or document?	It would take place through the portal in your sub- recipient, streamlined application. Cat Z, is the category of project that FEMA will write for management costs, when you request management costs in the streamlined application.
