Vaccines for a Period of Time During this Transition

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) is pleased to announce the expanded availability of several state-supplied vaccines for all children through 18 years of age.

Influenza Vaccine

Influenza vaccine (in multiple formulations) will be universally available for all children through 18 years of age regardless of insurance status beginning in the 2015-16 influenza season. Quadrivalent influenza vaccine will be available in the following formulations:

Hepatitis A, Tdap, Varicella Vaccines

Effective April 1, 2015, MDPH is expanding the availability of hepatitis A, Tdap, and varicella vaccines to all children through 18 years of age regardless of insurance status. This expanded availability will now allow providers to use state-supplied vaccine to provide catchup immunizations for those children who did not receive hepatitis A, Tdap, or varicella vaccinations at the recommended ages. As recommended by the Massachusetts Vaccine Purchasing Advisory Committee (MVPAC), brand choice is available for these vaccines:

Insurance Considerations

MDPH is requesting that insurance companies continue to reimburse providers who privately purchased influenza for the 2015-16 influenza season through March 31, 2016. Some providers have already pre-booked their vaccine doses, and we appreciate your consideration during this transition year.

MDPH is also requesting that insurance companies continue to reimburse providers who privately purchased pediatric hepatitis A, Tdap, and varicella vaccines through September 30, 2015. This will allow providers to use their remaining inventory of privately-purchased vaccines.
