




Memorial Drive Greenway Improvements

- Renovate and upgrade the greenway, in order to enhance safety and the path-users' experience
- Make environmental and landscape improvements, improving the water quality and habitat in the historic Charles River Basin.

Phase I: Fowler Street to Longfellow Bridge

Construction completed 2004 (\$4M)

Phase II: Longfellow Bridge to Boston University Boathouse

Construction completed 2016 (\$6.77M)

Phase III: Eliot Bridge to Boston University Bridge


Design Spring 2019 – Fall 2020 (\$650K)

Phase III Project Limits






What's Happened So Far

 - **➢** Bike, Pedestrian counts














