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DECISION

ROY VENTURES CORPORATION DBA THE END ZONE SPORTS PUB; THE OUTER LIMITS 39 MILFORD STREET MENDON, MA 01756 LICENSE#: 069000016 VIOLATION DATE: 07/25/2013 HEARD: 12/17/2013

Roy Ventures Corporation dba The End Zone Sports Pub; The Outer Limits (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, December 17, 2013, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05(2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 94 §186-Falling Below the Standard of Purity (12 counts). Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Keefe's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

- 1. Investigator Keefe's Report dated July 25, 2013; and
- 2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

<u>FACTS</u>

- 1. On Thursday, July 25, 2013, at approximately 8:00 p.m., Investigators Kujawski and Keefe conducted an investigation of the business operation of Roy Ventures Corporation dba The End Zone Sports Pub; The Outer Limits to determine the manner in which its business was being conducted and to investigate a complaint filed with this Commission.
- 2. Investigators identified themselves to the female bartender on duty, Anna. Anna called the owner, Roy P. Vaz. Anna stated that she was the owner's mother.
- 3. Investigator Keefe informed Ms. Vaz that an anonymous complaint had been filed with the Commission and that investigators would be conducting an inspection of the licensed premises.
- 4. While inspecting behind the bar, investigators observed 12 assorted alcoholic beverages bottles which contained foreign matter (fruit flies).
- 5. The bottles of alcohol were taken as evidence. They were:

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- o 1 bottle of Arrow Cianamon Schnapps;
- o 2 bottles of Arrow Anisette liqueur;
- o 2 bottles of Bacardi Limon rum;
- 1 bottle of Blackberry Flavored brandy;
- o I bottle of Dekuyper Amaretto liqueur;
- o 1 bottle of Jameson Irish whiskey;
- o 1 bottle of Jim Beam bourbon;
- o 1 bottle of Leroux Crème de Menthe liqueur;
- o I bottle of Martini & Rossi;
- o 1 bottle of Sutton Club whiskey.
- 6. Investigator Keefe informed Anna of the violation and that a report would be submitted to the Chief Investigator for review.

CONCLUSION

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05(2) Permitting an Illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 94 §186-Falling Below the Standard of Purity (12 counts). As the licensee has been in business for more than ten (10) years and has had no previous violations, the Commission issues a WARNING.
