DECISION

ALAM AND HOGUE INC. DBA RICHDALD SUPERETTE
1 MERRIMAC SQUARE

Alam and Hogue Inc. dba Richdale Superette (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, July 24, 2012, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05(2), to wit: c.138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Kenny's Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Kenny's Compliance Check Field Report dated April 26, 2012; and
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

FACTS

1. On Thursday, April 26, 2012, at approximately 08:28 p.m., Investigators Bailey and Kenny conducted an investigation of the business operation of Alam and Hogue Inc. dba Richdale Superette.
2. An underage operative working with investigators purchased an alcoholic beverage, a sixteen (16) ounce can of Bud Light beer for one dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION


Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2), to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, §34. Therefore, the Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days of which three (3) days will be held in abeyance for a period of two (2) years provided no further violations of Chapter 138 or Commission Regulations occur.**


