

Metal Screening Rules

All visitors and any staff without an employee identification badge who enter a DTA office will be subject to Metal Screening.

All persons must:

- remove all objects from pockets,
- allow coats, bags and items to be run through an X-ray machine,
- allow for hand searches of bags and/or the use of a hand wand.

All persons shall be required to pass through a screening device. If the device sounds an alarm, a uniformed security officer will use a handheld screening device to detect all metallic objects.

If a screening device is not working, uniformed security officers will conduct bag and package inspection searches by hand. DTA will display the following notice if the screening device is not working:

“No device is available at the present time for screening bags and packages. We apologize for the inconvenience.”

If you cannot be screened by a walk-through metal detector due to an internal medical device, such as an artificial hip, other metal implant, pacemaker, or a defibrillator, please inform the security officer for accommodations.

If an individual refuses to be screened, he or she will be denied access to the facility.
