


# Why is the Farmland Action Plan important?

### We are losing agricultural land fast!

### Between 1997 and 2022 Massachusetts lost 113,000 acres

Additional 50,000 – 89,000 acres projected to be lost by 2040

 Successful farms are one of the best tools for protecting farmland




## Increase access to farmland

# Who will implement the Plan?

This is a plan for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

MDAR is promoting, monitoring and facilitating implementation of the Plan, building momentum from existing programs and initiatives.



## Strategies for each goal



### Protection

- A. Permanently protect farmland through purchases of agricultural restrictions
- B. Further develop and implement additional tools to avoid farmland loss and retain farmland
- C. Prioritize protection of whole farms
- D. Formalize and integrate decision-making processes regarding farmland protection



### Access



## Farmland Protection at MDAR

#### **APR Acquisition related changes**

- APR accepts applications at any time
- APR ranking now quarterly (previously annually)
- Raised the APR price per acre cap to \$34k/acre (and it only applies to MDAR funds spent, not appraised value)
- Updated the APR scoring sheet
- MDAR is now a certified ACEP ALE entity, so can close faster on ACEP projects

#### **APR Acquisition reminders**

- No soils requirements for APR
  - Confusion with NRCS ACEP ALE that does
- No maximum forest limitation
  - Confusion with NRCS ACEP ALE that does
- Not required to use ACEP ALE in conjunction with APR.

#### **APR Stewardship related changes**

 Hired more APR Stewardship staff and have a system in place to have contact with all APR owners annually

#### Other changes

MDAR now has authority to buy land (not just restrict)

- NO COST to participate, meetings at your farm over course of a year
- Applications accepted on rolling basis, to be reviewed <u>January 15, 2025</u> for next round to start in the spring

## Other updates

#### Solar

- Department of Energy Resources (DOER) is proposing changes to the SMART solar program including Agri-Voltaics and ground mounted solar.
- December 10th DOER host a virtual technical session to share their revisions and take feedback.

#### **Climate Smart Agriculture Program**

- Online application available
- Application deadline is January 7 at 4PM.
- \$50,000 matching grant.
- Examples of eligible items for funding are efficient irrigation systems, reduced tillage equipment, silvo-pasture fencing, energy efficient equipment.

#### **Opportunities to license state lands**

- MDAR licenses out over 1000 acres of farmland including properties in Templeton, Danvers, Westborough and Agawam
- MDAR is actively working to increase its land holdings through the State Land Licensing program.
- Recently acquired control of properties in Templeton and Monson.
- When existing licenses expire land is offered through a bidding process at very low rates for 5 year periods with the opportunity to extend by another 5 years.
- Look out for new licenses in the next few years as there will be land going out for bid
