


 Formalization of data analysis/policy work that MHP has done for the past decade

 Collect, share and analyze key housing metrics – in collaboration with other public and private partners – to help guide state conversations and support city and town government


Massachusetts population by age cohort by year: 1970 to 2016








Massachusetts Housing Production Compared to Projected Demand 2011-2016
