CONSENT AGREEMENT FOR VOLUNTARY SURRENDER

The Massachusetts Board of Registration in Pharmacy ("Board") and Michel Maraney ("Licensee"), a pharmacy technician trainee licensed by the Board, PTT01245, do hereby stipulate and agree that the following information shall be entered into and become a permanent part of the Licensee's record maintained by the Board:

- 1. The Licensee acknowledges that the Board opened a complaint against his Massachusetts pharmacy technician trainee license related to the conduct set forth in Paragraph 2, identified as Docket No. PHA-2018-0081 ("the Complaint").1
- 2. The Board and the Licensee acknowledge and agree to the following facts:
 - a. From approximately June 2018 until approximately October 12, 2018, Licensee worked as a pharmacy technician trainee at CVS # 1007 ("Pharmacy"), DS90074, located in Brockton, Massachusetts.
 - b. While working as a pharmacy technician trainee at the Pharmacy, Licensee diverted the following controlled substances:
 - i. 277 alprazolam 1 mg tablets;
 - ii. 135 alprazolam 2 mg tablets; and
 - iii. 971 ml promethazine-codeine 6.25-10mg/5ml oral solution.

Licensee did not have a prescription for said controlled substances.

3. The Licensee agrees the conduct described in Paragraph 2 constitutes a violation of M.G.L. c. 94C, § 34 and warrants disciplinary action by the Board under M.G.L. c. 112, §§ 42A and 61, 247 CMR 10.03(1)(h) & (x).

- 4. The Licensee agrees to SURRENDER his pharmacy technician trainee license for an indefinite period of time and refrain from practicing as a pharmacy technician trainee and from working in any pharmacy-related setting in Massachusetts, commencing with the date on which the Board signs this Agreement ("Effective Date").
- 5. The Licensee agrees that he will not practice as a pharmacy technician trainee or work in a pharmacy related setting in Massachusetts from the Effective Date unless and until the Board reinstates his license.²
- 6. The Board agrees that in return for the Licensee's execution of this Agreement it will not prosecute the Complaint.
- 7. The Licensee understands that he has a right to formal adjudicatory hearing concerning the allegations against him and that during said adjudication he would possess the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses, to call witnesses, to present evidence, to testify on his own behalf, to contest the allegations, to present oral argument, to appeal to the courts, and all other rights as set forth in the Massachusetts Administrative Procedures Act, M.G.L. c. 30A, and the Standard Adjudicatory Rules of Practice and Procedure, 801 CMR 1.01 et seq. The Licensee further understands that by executing this Agreement he is knowingly and voluntarily waiving his right to a formal adjudication of the Complaint.
- 8. The Licensee acknowledges that he has been at all times free to seek and use legal counsel in connection with the Complaint and this Agreement.
- 9. The Licensee acknowledges that after the Effective Date, the Agreement constitutes a public record of disciplinary action by the Board. The Board may forward a copy of this Agreement to other licensing boards, law enforcement entities, and other individuals or entities as required or permitted by law.

² The Licensee understands that practice as a licensed pharmacy technician trainee includes, but is not limited to, seeking and/or accepting a paid or voluntary position as a licensed pharmacy technician trainee, or a paid or voluntary position requiring that the applicant hold a current pharmacy technician trainee license. The Licensee further understands that if he accepts a voluntary or paid position as a pharmacy technician trainee, or engages in any practice of pharmacy after the Effective Date and before the Board formally reinstates his license, evidence of such practice shall be grounds for the Board's referral of any such unlicensed practice to the appropriate law enforcement authorities for prosecution.
