

MILITARY AFFIDAVIT INSTRUCTIONS FOR SELF-REPRESENTED LITIGANTS

What is this form?	The Military Affidavit is a legal document that informs the court if a person in the case belongs to the United States Military or Uniformed Services.
Where can I find the form?	You can find the form here: https://www.mass.gov/doc/military-affidavit/download
When do I need to file this form?	You need to file a Military Affidavit in any case where the Defendant (the person you are filing your case against) does not come to court or respond to court notices. Usually, you file this form at the beginning of your court case. If you filed this form more than three months ago, you may be asked to fill it out again.
Why do I need to file this form?	The Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA) is a federal law that provides special benefits and protections for members of the United States Military and Uniformed Services. The Court cannot enter a judgment against a person in the U.S. Military who doesn't come to court while in active service. If you file a case, you must tell the Court, to the best of your knowledge, whether the Defendant is currently serving in any of the branches of the U.S. Military listed below:
	 Army Navy Air Force Marine Corps Coast Guard
	 The form also applies to: Commissioned officers in the Public Health Service & National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration on active-duty military service and for up to one year after active duty. National Guard members on certain assignments. U.S. citizens serving with certain allied military forces.
	You must also fill out the Massachusetts Trial Court's Military Affidavit if you are seeking a default judgment against a servicemember, as described above. A default judgment is a judgment in favor of the party (you) suing the servicemember, if the servicemember does not respond to the lawsuit.

Key Terms	"Subscribed and certified or declared to be true under penalty of perjury": This means that you swear what you are writing is true to the best of your knowledge. Party/Parties: A person or people who is/are a part of a case. This includes the defendant and any other adult person whose name is written on the documents in your case.

- 1. create an account to conduct the search; and
- 2. provide the other parties' birth dates or SS#.
- ref you choose to use this website, you are required to attach a copy of those search results called "the Status" Report from the Department of Defense Manpower Data Center."

- Please attach any written correspondence you receive from the military in support of your statement.

Note: The term "military service" includes the following: active duty service as a member of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard; service as a member of the National Guard under a call to active service authorized by the President or the Secretary of Defense for a period of more than 30 consecutive days for

purposes of responding to a national emergency; active service as a commissioned officer of the Public Health Service or of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration; and any period of service during which a servicemember is absent from duty on account of sickness, wounds, leave, or other lawful cause. 50 U.S.C. § 3911(2). A U.S. citizen who is serving with the forces of a nation with which the United States is allied in a war or military action may also be entitled to relief under the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act if that service is similar to the definition of "military service" discussed above. See 50 U.S.C. § 3914.
