Subject: Minimum Wage Increase

Purpose: To notify Local Workforce Boards, One-Stop Career Center Operators and other

local workforce partners of the increase to the minimum wage in Massachusetts to

\$10.00 an hour.

Background: Workers in Massachusetts must now be paid a minimum wage of \$10 an hour, up

from the previous minimum of \$9. The wage increase takes effect under legislation that was approved in 2014, and that also calls for another increase in

2017, to \$11 an hour.

Also starting Friday, workers who earn tips of \$20 or more a month must be paid

at least \$3.35 an hour, and along with their tips, their wage must total at least \$10

an hour. If not, employers are required to make up the difference.

State officials said violations should be reported to the attorney general's Fair

Labor Division.
