**CALL TO ORDER**: The meeting was called to order by Ms. Valente at 1:35 PM.

#### Item #1 MOTION- VOTE

The motion was made by Rachel Madden, seconded by Steven McCurdy and **voted unanimously in favor** of acceptance and approval of the minutes of the meeting held on November 4, 2015.

#### Item #2 MOTION- VOTE

The motion was made by Rachel Madden, seconded by Steven McCurdy and **voted unanimously in favor** of acceptance and approval of the minutes of the meeting held on November 18, 2015.

### Item #3 **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

Ms. Perez reported on the following:

- 1. Series 19 has been moving along, with structuring currently in process. The Trust is planning to sell the bonds competitively in late January, with a closing date in February.
- 2. The Trust's single audit includes a finding regarding invoice dates for transactions financed with federal funds outside of the grant period. The Trust will implement a process for fixing this issue going forward and explain to EPA the measures that will be taken. There is no official report from the auditors at this point. Their report will be presented to EPA when available.
- 3. The Trust will not draw the FY2015 federal grant for MWRA loans. Other projects will be used instead, as there is an issue with the dates on MWRA's invoices, which could be outside the grant period.
- Mr. McCurdy reported on the following:
- 1. MassDEP held its hearings on the 2016 Intended Use Plan. The plan should be finalized soon. In order to finalize the plan, approval must be received from MassDEP, EPA and the Governor's office. The goal is to have the plan finalized by the end of December, 2015.

#### Item #4 MOTION- VOTE

### Funds Transfer Program: Authorization of a Permanent Funds Transfer from Clean Water to Drinking Water Equity for Federal Fiscal Year 2015

- 1. That, pursuant to and as further implementation of the Funds Transfer Program approved by the Board on January 8, 2014, the Board hereby re-affirms the Executive Director's authority to make such transfers between the Clean Water SRF and the Drinking Water SRF as she determines to be necessary, including without limitation a permanent transfer of \$5,389,890, which is the maximum allowable amount for Federal Fiscal Year 2015, from the Clean Water SRF to the Drinking Water SRF.
- 2. That the Executive Director is further authorized to take all necessary steps to effectuate such transfer, including executing and delivering any and all letters, certificates, and other instruments and documents necessary or desirable in connection therewith and obtaining any necessary opinions of counsel.
