D. General Issues and Updates from DFS

Marshal Ostroskey explained that pandemic operations continue, and the Department is continuing to maintain COVID-19 protocols. We are all trying to stay healthy with most staff being in the office four days per week with one telework day.

Fire Equipment Grant funds were released, and S.A.F.E. Grants should be out this week.

Bridgewater is making progress as first phase of the Master Plan is complete. The mechanical, electrical, and plumbing (M.E.P) plans are 90% complete. The Department anticipates a March delivery for the AFG Search and Rescue Prop.

The Department is still advertising the MFA Director position and it is being publicized nationally. The posting will be open until the end of March.

Marshal Ostroskey wanted to recognize Ed Kawa, Chief of Engineering Inspections; Paul Vigneau, Director of the Division of Fire Safety; the Fire Investigators and Boiler Pressure Vessel Engineers for the great work they did during the Vicinity Energy Plant investigation and identifying best practices to prevent such an incident from happening again.

Deputy Marshal Fournier updated the Commission on the CT scans which continue to be a great success and is hoping that PCA blood tests and mammograms ay be available in the future. COVID-19 did shut down the process for a couple weeks due to staffing issues.

The Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance is assisting with PFAS clean up. The scope of the problem is growing and DCAMM is looking at other solutions which is the reason for slow progress.
