# C. General Issues and Updates from DFS

Fire Marshal Davine briefed the Commission on the ASHER survey that was recently sent out to police and fire chiefs; to date, 200 responses have been received and ~35% are looking for course deliveries. This data will help organize future offerings while there are currently five offerings in FY24 at large colleges.

Lithium-Ion battery training/course development for firefighters is underway with the hope of a late June rollout available via the learning management system (LMS).

On November 15<sup>th</sup> a "White Powder Symposium" will be held at Gillette Stadium with the attendance goal of ~800 attendees; following the "kick-off" there will be additional targeted training.

June 10<sup>th</sup> the next Command Staff Orientation will be held in Stow.

The anonymous mental health survey has had over 2,000 responses and all data will be reviewed next month.
