<b>Statement of Interest</b>	<p>In 2010, during his State of the Union address, President Obama criticized a Supreme Court ruling from earlier that year, which he warned could "open up the floodgates to special interests" in our elections. At the time, I had little comprehension of how corporate money could corrupt our political system. After the outcome of the 2016 Presidential race, however, I noticed that from 2008 to 2016 special interest spending in federal elections had risen by nearly 400% - a concerning development. As a student at the College of the Holy Cross double majoring in political science and philosophy and planning on a career in public service, I would be honored to serve on the Citizens Commission to help limit the growing power of super PACS. Currently, I am a member of the College's nationally ranked moot court team, where I have become familiar with substantive issues of constitutional law through research of court cases and legal precedents. In particular, I have spent extensive time conducting research on campaign finance reform that includes studying referenced legal cases in the Citizens United ruling, as well as accompanying literature on the subject. Through oral arguments, brief writing, and a publication of a weekly campus blog, I have developed excellent oral and written communication skills. Finally, as a younger citizen, I can afford the commission an invaluable perspective on the influence of concentrated money on the internet and social media during political campaigns.</p>
