

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR MPTC INSTRUCTOR CERTIFICATION

- **MPTC Instructor Designations: Years of Law Enforcement Experience: five (5) years**
- Instructor: This is the largest category of instructors and includes anyone certified to teach the MPTC academic or tactical curriculum in a specific subject matter.
- Instructor Lead: This limited group of instructors serves as the primary instructor for practical skills courses. A practical skills course is defined as a class that includes training in skills not conducive to a classroom setting. These practical skills topics require multiple instructors per class. To become a Lead Instructor, the instructor must be certified and has been teaching in that discipline for at least two (2) years AND is recommended as a Lead Instructor by either an Academy Director or a Statewide Coordinator.
- Instructor Trainer: This limited group of instructors is responsible for training and qualifying instructors. Instructor trainers are selected by the MPTC and Statewide Coordinators.
