MRC NextGen Career Grant Location Proposal

We are proposing three regional locations for the NextGen Grant:

- Boston Area (Downtown, Roxbury, Braintree) could also be expanded to include Somerville/Malden
- Merrimack Valley (Lawrence, Lowell)
- West District (Springfield and Worcester)

These regional locations have a combination of high numbers of youth age 18 to 30 currently served by VR, high proportions of target disability groups (sensory, Autism, DD), and have concentrations of African-American, Hispanic, and/or Asian populations, both currently served by VR and in the overall community. Additionally, these catchment areas include Community Colleges, State Universities, large School Districts, and Pre-ETS potentially eligible student pools that will be critical for recruitment to the project through both existing and new partnerships. Utilizing these regions and partnering with these referral sources will assist in reaching the targets for recruitment for the NextGen Career Grant.
