MRC Transitional Internship Program (TIP)

Program Description

The Transitional Internship Program (TIP) provides job and skills training, internship, and placement services to young people with significant disabilities from the ages of 16 to 22 who are exiting special education and transitioning into the adult human services system.

The TIP Program aims to prepare youth with any type of disability, including physical, cognitive, sensory or emotional limitations, for the transition to adult human services and to greater independence in the community. The TIP program supports the MRC's ongoing youth agenda by providing transition age youth with disabilities the kinds of invaluable early work experiences that they often miss out on.

Program Benefits

- Opportunities for early work exposure, through summer jobs or internships, developing skills and experience.
- Bringing more transition-age youth with disabilities into the workforce and reducing the high unemployment for individuals with disabilities.
- Soft skill and technical skill development, resumes, references, and workplace exposure.

Program History & Features

Since 2011, the MRC has utilized federal reallottment monies to fund the Transitional Internship Program (TIP), to provide vocational programming for transition-age youth with disabilities. TIP provides pre-employment skills training, ongoing support, and paid summer employment or internships to youth who are in high school, have recently graduated, or who have left school before graduating.

Funding has grown from a total of \$300,000 in the first year to \$750,000 in FY14. TIP programs provide an expanding range of job placement sites, work experiences, and intern roles that give youth with disabilities valuable first-time exposure to work settings.

Since 2011, over 500 youth have participated in TIP, and more than 82 youth have been offered continued employment by their internship hosts. Participants have had a wide range of functional impairments, including significant cognitive, mental health and behavioral issues. There has been a 70% increase in TIP applications over the past 3 years.
