COLA Update

The Governor and the Legislature have proposed a 3% Cost-of-Living Adjustment ("COLA") for retirees on the first \$13,000 base pension. This provision is now before the FY'24 Conference Committee.

Typically, the COLA is a line item within the Commonwealth's fiscal year budget. If a COLA is approved, benefit recipients will receive the COLA as soon as administratively possible with their regular monthly benefit payment.

WEP/GPO Check-in

Earlier this year, Representative Garret Graves (R-LA) introduced H.R. 82 to the House of Representatives. <u>H.R. 82, or the</u> <u>Social Security Fairness Act of 2023</u>, is a bill to repeal the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and the Government Pension Offset (GPO). The bill currently has 281 co-sponsors. The bill was referred to the House Ways and Means Remembering Maureen Valente, State Retirement Board Member

A similar bill was jointly filed in the U.S. Senate by Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH) under <u>S.597</u>. This bill has 44 sponsors and was referred to the Committee on Finance on March 1, 2023. At the time of this writing, the bill has yet to have any action taken on it.

June Is World Elder Abuse Awareness Month

Throughout the month, government agencies, businesses, and organizations sponsor events to unite communities, seniors, caregivers, governments, and the private sector to raise awareness of the cultural, social, economic, and demographic processes affecting elder abuse and neglect.

According to Mark Majestic, Associate Commissioner for the Office of Program Integrity, this abuse can take many forms, such as physical, neglect, emotional, or financial exploitation. More than 1 in 10 adults experience abuse each year – though this number could be higher as elder abuse can be underreported.

In an article on Social Security's website,

abuse victims may have some behavioral red flags – such as depression, fear, anxiety, or intentional isolation. Some signs of neglect may include:

- Poor nutrition or hygiene.
- Lack of necessary medical aids, like glasses or medication.
- Unpaid rent.
- Sudden changes to a will.
- Unusual changes in money management.

Benefit Payment

Some of you may notice changes to the June monthly pension amount you receive at the end of the month if you have health insurance benefits administered through the Commonwealth's Group Insurance Commission. The monthly premium deduction for many plans through the GIC will change beginning in June. To view the new rates or for more information, go online to mass.gov/gic.

Note: all benefit recipients will receive a paper pay statement for the June payment.
