Massachusetts State Employees' Retirement System ("MSERS") Actuarial Valuation Report Released

The most recent Actuarial Valuation of the Massachusetts State Employees' Retirement System ("MSERS") has been released. The valuation compares the assets and liabilities of the MSERS and provides information using investment, economic, and demographic assumptions to assess its long-term sustainability.

As of January 1, 2021, the report reflects the MSERS with 87,136 active members and 66,901 retirees and survivors/beneficiaries. The number of active members remained at approximately the same level as the last valuation report in 2019, while the number of retirees increased by 2,143. The report reflects more than 4,500 former vested members who have separated from service but have not yet initiated retirement benefits.

The MSERS' funded ratio (the Actuarial Value of Assets/the total Actuarial Accrued Liability) improved to 66.5%. The progress occurred despite reducing the investment return assumption to 7.0% from 7.15% in 2020 and improvements in mortality measurements. The market value of plan assets as of January 1,

Treasurer Goldberg Announces Latest Release of Unclaimed Property Listings

Massachusetts State Treasurer Deborah Goldberg has <u>announced</u> the latest grouping of names that have been added to the state's list of unclaimed property owners. Over 49,000 new properties worth millions of dollars are owed to individuals and businesses throughout the Commonwealth.

"We currently hold over \$3.4 billion in unclaimed property at Treasury, and it could be yours," said State Treasurer Goldberg. "One in ten Massachusetts residents are owed money. Call our office today to begin the claims process."

This newly released list includes only individuals and businesses with unclaimed property over \$100. Treasurer Goldberg urged all citizens to check the 2021, was \$32.611b. (Assets as of August 31, 2021, stood at more than \$36b).

The average age of MSERS retirees/survivors increased to 72.2 years of age, with the average annual benefit equaling \$38,419.00. Total benefits issued for 2020 were more than \$2.570b.

"The report reflects the positive long-term sustainability of the retirement system as a result of several factors. The Commonwealth's funding strategy, a critical component that must continue; the dedicated participation and contributions of MSERS members; and the highly successful investment strategy of plan assets by PRIM," stated Nick Favorito, Executive Director of the Massachusetts State Retirement Board.

Advance Child Tax Credit Payments in 2021

According to the IRS' website, there have been some changes to the Child Tax Credit that may help eligible families get advance payments of the credit starting this past July, including grandparents raising children. The advance payment is available to taxpayers with a "qualifying child" who have a main home in the United States for more than half the year.

The IRS' website clarifies that a "qualifying child", for purposes of the 2021 Child Tax Credit, is an individual who does not turn 18 before January 1, 2022 and <u>who satisfies certain</u> <u>conditions</u>.
