Visitor Center Open Hours

Speaker Series

On Sunday afternoons explore a variety of presenters all related to the Range. For all ages.

January 11 — Reimagining the Role of Botanic Gardens, with Smith College

Join John Berryhill, Director of the Smith College Botanic Garden, for an exploration of the questions that have sparked a profound shift in botanic gardens in the 21st century. Highlighting Smith's meaningful collaboration, student-centered innovation, and deprioritized collecting the exotic, turning our gaze to the familiar - including the Mount Holyoke Range. Open to all ages.

January 25 — Snakes of Massachusetts

Discover local Massachusetts snakes in an interactive talk accompanied by a slide show. Explore snake life cycles, their benefits to ecosystems, and compare images of local snakes. Meet ambassador snakes up close - Naga the corn snake, and Inky the king snake! Open to all ages.

February 1 — Dinosaurs, Dunes, and Drifting Continents, with Prof. Richard Little

Dive into the geo-history of the Connecticut River Valley with Professor Richard Little. Uncover a timeline of geologic formations around Range. Open to all ages.

February 28 - Summit House Film Screening

Join a modest screening of the 1976 documentary film that changed the future of the historic Mt. Holyoke Summit House. Step back in time and view the 30-minute documentary, followed by a 30-minute virtual live meet-and-greet with the filmmaker herself, Gwen Clancy. Open to all ages.
